Adventure Photo will provide ARTS' youth with the opportunity to explore four different San Diego spaces and landmarks while learning beginning and intermediate photography techniques. Students will be introduced to various types of imagery including: street photography, portraiture, and landscape/outdoor photography. Students will be invited to engage their curiosity by practicing these different methods through hands-on group field trips. This class is all about showing the world through our lens by capturing moments, spaces, people, and things that each of us find interesting. Classes will alternate over 8 weeks between in-class instruction and field trips.

Photo Youth Voice (HS)

Youth voices around the world are being elevated through different forms of media such as photography and video, providing youth an opportunity to drive conversations around the issues facing their families and communities. In "Photo Youth Voice," participants will share their own unique perspectives of these issues as youth media photojournalists. Participants of the program will learn how to capture candid and posed portraits, documentary and detail-oriented images to create photo essays and tell their stories.

Choir(ages 11+)
